Introduction

Welcome to I Heard a Bird Sing!

I'm Jake Alexander – a composer and musical director – and this book brings together a collection of my rounds and canons, written especially for choirs to enjoy.

The songs are designed to be flexible. Feel free to experiment with tempo and dynamics, and shape each sing-through in whatever way best suits your group. They are set in keys that will work for most choirs, though you may wish to transpose them to match your singers more precisely. A few include optional piano accompaniments, but all work beautifully a cappella.

Most rounds divide into three or four parts, though you might like to begin with a single line and gradually build the layers. Endings are open to interpretation: you could let each section fade away in turn, or – as I often prefer – repeat the final phrase until every voice joins in unison.

Some pieces are simple enough to teach by ear and make excellent warm-ups; others may benefit from scores or lyric sheets. Whatever the method, I encourage singers to put the paper aside at some point, lift their heads, and listen. That's when real cohesion – and the joy of shared sound – emerges.

A quick tip: many of these songs are polyphonic, with rhythms that weave around each other rather than aligning exactly. If timing is a challenge, encourage singers to listen outward as well as inward. One useful strategy is to scatter them around the room, or even have them walk slowly as they sing – once they know the song well enough to do so.

The texts are drawn from poetry, prose, proverbs, and speeches – a mixture of favourite lines I've carried with me for years and gems I've only recently discovered. I hope you find as much pleasure in singing them as I did in setting them to music.

Finally, my thanks go to Amandine, Maïwenn, Eliot, Priya Bose, Eleanor Rastall, Jean & John Shirley, Jenn Mischenko, and My Johansson for their help in bringing this book to life; and to my choirs – Quaggy Community Choir, Crib Notes, Raised Voices, Greenwich Foundation Choir, Sing Streatham, and KT6 – for indulging me in so many musical experiments.




This round actually works in 4 parts - you can do it this way if you prefer. However, I prefer having just 3 parts and a little more space.





As an alternative, singers may sing the last phrase in the opposite direction, as shown here... Options include different groups singing different versions of the phrase, all groups moving to the downward phrase at a pre-arranged moment, or singers simply being allowed to sing either phrase at random - the lines are imaginary after all!







- Sing through in unison, then as a two part canon, and finally as a three part canon.
- On the final time through, Voices 1 and 2 hold and pause on "snr" while Voice 3 holds "slow". All voices come off the chord together, before since snow" in unison. (This means that Voices 1 and 2 sing "Descer" twice.)




